# Abstract

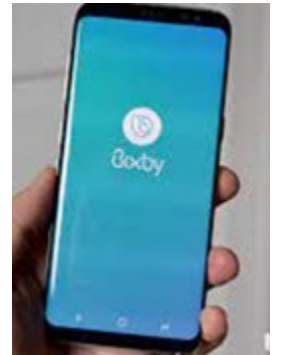
---

- How are virtual assistants used to do schoolwork?
  - Siri, Google Assistant, Alexa, Bixby
- Method: surveyed college and university students
  - 121 students with and 51 without disabilities
  - Goal: find out how students use virtual assistants to do schoolwork
- Results (LimeSurvey)
  - 2% - 15% of students used virtual assistants to do schoolwork
  - Mainly for calendar alerts, internet research, & dictionary
- Conclusions
  - Are Siri, Google Assistant and Alexa ready for college? “No!”

# Method: 121 Students with & 51 Without Disabilities

---

- Did you use a smartphone to do schoolwork?
  - If yes, which type of smartphone(s) did you use? (iPhone, Android, Other)
- Did you use a tablet to do schoolwork?
  - If yes, which type of tablet(s) did you use? (iPad, Android, Other)
- If you used \_\_\_\_\_ for schoolwork, what school related tasks did you use this for?
  - Siri
  - Google Assistant
  - Alexa
  - Bixby (Samsung)



# Results 1

- Overall, little use made of these
  - Similar proportions of the 2 groups
  - More smartphones (58%) than tablets
  - 63% of smartphones & 82% of tablets are Apple



Virtual assistant	Students with a disability	Students without disabilities
Google Assistant	15%	8%
Siri	12%	12%
Alexa	2%	4%
Bixby	2%	2%

# Results 2



- Mainly used for
  - Calendars / scheduling / alerts, internet / research, dictionary

Schedule/calendar/alerts/reminders	9	8	3	1	21
Internet/research	2	9		2	13
Dictionary/definitions	6	2	2		10
Spelling	4	1	2		7
